The LETR was quickly adopted by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), the Founding organization of the Law Enforcement Torch Run® for Special Olympics.

What started as a flicker over 40 years ago has grown into a roaring flame of support and stability for Special Olympics athletes worldwide.
